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Writing a Tender Specification

What is Writing A Tender Specification?

Writing a Tender Specification is the one-day course which teaches you how to write a compliant specification.

Specifications, which are the sole responsibility of the authority, must be written in a non-discriminatory fashion to ensure that all bidders have the same opportunity to participate in the procurement exercise. This will also ensure that you have the widest possible list of suppliers to score from.

Why should you learn about Writing a Tender Specification?

Following the introduction of the Public Contracts Regulations 2015, it is more necessary than ever for authorities to get the specification right first time.

It is important to consider early what technical, functional or performance requirements will go towards defining the requirement as this will make your specifications work harder towards a sustainable and efficient result.

You need your specifications to be compliant in order to reduce your organisation's risk of challenge.

- Why you shouldn't be using proprietary terms
- How to include technical specifications that should, where feasible, be output or outcome based
- Why you should be clear in your expectations of how to evaluate Added Value

The Format of the Training

What is the format of the training?
